You need to know:

~~Newton's~~ law of conservation of momentum:

[In the absence of an external force in a certain direction, the total momentum of a system in that direction remains constant.]

$$m_1 u_1 + m_2 u_2 = m_1 v_1 + m_2 v_2 \quad \text{L.C.M}$$

The impulse is a large force applied for a short time on a body (eg hitting a ball). The impulse imparted on a body is the change in its momentum.

$$\text{Impulse} = F t = m \vec{v} - m \vec{u}$$

force time

Newton's experimental law

$$\frac{\text{new relative velocity}}{\text{old relative velocity}}$$

NEL

$$\frac{v_1 - v_2}{u_1 - u_2} = -e$$

coefficient of restitution

$e=1$ if a collision is perfectly elastic
 $e < 1$ if not (usual)

	mass	velocity before	velocity after
particle A	m_1	u_1	v_1
B	m_2	u_2	v_2

Also remember: potential energy = mgh

kinetic energy = $\frac{1}{2}mv^2$

conservation of energy: $mgh + \frac{1}{2}mr^2 = \text{constant}$.
